INTRODUCTION

These three-days of short-term joint staff training event bring together researchers and practitioners from all DESINC LIVE partner institutions, in order to explore the interface between the social inclusion of international migrants in local urban areas and the experiences in non-conventional and innovative teaching techniques oriented to educators, students and professors in the fields of architecture, urban design and urban planning. By relying on the previous DESINC project outputs, the aim here is to lay the foundations of interactive and original pedagogies, by outlining a set of strategies, instruments and materials that are able to make migration-related issues more deeply connected to the teaching of urban design and planning.

The short-term joint staff training event aims to support participants in:

- 1. Sharing and socialising the key-words and principles of DESINC, in order to create continuity between the two experiences and facilitate cooperation among all participating partners.
- 2. Examining different aspects of living and dwelling in the context of migration (with a specific focus on housing and the right to the city) in order to apply this lesson to their own practice and teaching/training activity.
- 3. Sharing and analysing educational and research experiences in the contexts of migration, capable of providing insights that are useful for the creation of the DESINC LIVE educational offer.
- 4. **Designing the educational offer** with specific regard to the identification of its main subjects, as well as its structure, format and potential public.

This joint short-term staff training event has been co-designed and developed by the DESINC LIVE teams of University of Sheffield, Architecture Sans Frontières UK and Politecnico di Milano.

Guido Belloni holds a M.A. in Urban Planning and Territorial Policies at the Polytechnic of Milan and the HafenCity Universität Hamburg. In the last years, he has been carrying out independent research on different topics: the reception policies of asylum seekers and refugees; the relationships of migrants with urban systems; social movements and the right to housing; the production of conflict in the public space. Since 2011, he has been volunteering to protect the rights of irregular foreign citizens with the Naga association in Milan. He is also member of the Escapes laboratory since 2013.

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SMS – Spazio di Mutuo Soccorso is a socio-political project deriving from years of struggles and projects that have developed since the Social Center "Il Cantiere" and the Inhabitants Committee of San Siro. SMS is in seeks to affirm the right to the city and to living. Spazio Aperto Servizi is a social enterprise founded in Milan in 1993, with the aim of taking care of people who live in situations of fragility, through a network of healthcare, social assistance, educational and housing services. Every day, Spazio Aperto Servizi dedicates itself to families in difficulty, the elderly, homeless people, migrants, disabled children and adults, traumatised minors and young people with autism spectrum disorder. With each of them it designs highly individualized paths, in order to help the achievement of autonomy and inclusion. Its general aim is the creation of an inclusive and welcoming space, that is capable of enhancing differences and eliminating discrimination.

Dar=Casa is a non-profit co-operative founded in 1991. Its mission is to create affordable housing for low- and moderate-income citizens in Milan and surrounding areas. In order to achieve these goals, Dar=Casa obtains and then renovates vacant or dismissed apartments. Usually it rents property owned by the Municipality of Milan or other public institutions, for whose restoration or management the local government cannot provide the necessary funding. Dar=Casa repairs the buildings and renovates apartments to rent them out to the members of the co-operative at a fixed, fair and affordable price.

Beatrice De Carli (team co-ordinator)

Beatrice De Carli is an architect and a Lecturer in Urban Design at the University of Sheffield, School of Architecture, where she directs the school's postgraduate taught programmes. In her research and teaching, Beatrice employs a collaborative, practice-based approach to address issues of equality, diversity and inclusion in urban space through both the study of existing urban environments and the development of alternative forms of design practice. Recent projects have focussed on grassroots innovations in the production of low-income housing in Brazil and South Africa, and on emerging forms of urban practice and pedagogy that respond to global challenges such as migration and climate change. Alongside her academic commitments, Beatrice works as a volunteer Associate and General Manager at Architecture Sans Frontières UK (ASF-UK), a design non-profit that operates in the field of community and international development, and served as a Member of the Board of Directors of ASF-International for several years. In July 2018 Beatrice was selected for a RIBA Ethel Day Award as one of 130 influential Women in Architecture from around the world.

Markus Bader (team co-ordinator)

Markus Bader is an architect and a university professor. Since 2016 he leads the chair of architecture and building planning at the Institute of Architecture and Urban Planning, within UdK, the University of the Arts of Berlin. He has been Guest Professor at the Peter Behrens School of Architecture in Düsseldorf, and was further Guest Professor for the Architecture Research Studio at the Academy of Art, Architecture and Design in Prague. He is a member of the Berlin Council of Arts and one of the initiators of the "Haus der Statistik". He has achieved international recognition with several artworks, often involving urban public space. He is one of the founders of Raumlabor Berlin, an urban commons that since 2016 is developing the "Coop Campus" project, an urban gardening nursery, school and collective meeting space for refugees and long-term Berliners.

Viviana d'Auria (team co-ordinator)

Viviana d'Auria trained as an architect and urbanist at Roma Tre University (Italy) and pursued studies in Human Settlements at the KU Leuven (Belgium) where she also completed her doctoral inquiry. She has been NWO Rubicon fellow at the Department of Geography, Planning and International Development Studies of the University of Amsterdam and is currently Assistant Professor in International Urbanism at the Department of Architecture, KU Leuven. Exploring 'practiced' architecture is an integral part of her research within a more general interest in the transcultural construction of cities and their contested spaces.

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Katharina Rohde

Katharina Rohde is an urban practitioner. In her work she explores spatial, social and economic inequalities and visualises inherent potentials and strategies of urban actors in the production of their (survivalist) habitat. She is a PhD candidate at KU Leuven with a focus on migrant agency in Berlin and Johannesburg within the OSA research track 'Urbanisms of Pluralism'.

Francesca Cognetti is associate professor of Territorial and Urban Analysis at the Department of Architecture and Urban Studies and Rector's Delegate on Civic Engagement and Social Responsibility at Politecnico di Milano. She is the coordinator of the action-research project Mapping San Siro, an experimental living lab aimed at sharing knowledge between academia and a large-scale public housing neighbourhood in Milan.

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
Anton Schünemann
